Business Roundtable Success Stories

Village of Rantoul

EDC worked in partnership with the Village on the Transportation Committee as part of the larger Rantoul Tomorrow strategic initiative - included bringing employers together and collecting & analyzing data to address the issue (accessibility and transportation for workers). Led to the development of a bus plan which will positively impact the region, employers, and offer better accessibility of the Village to the general population.

CUUATS Transportation Planning Group (the transportation entity of the Champaign County RPC)

EDC hosted two employer roundtables for the Transportation and Economic Development Plan - feedback helped develop plan initiatives to identify existing economic development goals in the Champaign-Urbana urbanized area that can be supported by transportation planning, policy, and infrastructure improvements.


